Here's what we learned today...

We read parts of this Scripture:

Joshua 23–24; Judges 3–5

We heard this Bible story:

The people of Israel are now living in the land, but they keep turning away from God. God then sends judgment on them for breaking their covenant with him. The people repent and turn back to God, and then God sends salvation from their enemies, such as through Deborah and Barak.

We talked about these ideas:

- God's promises are bigger than people can imagine.
- People cannot be faithful to God because of their broken hearts.
- God is patient and keeps teaching people to depend on him.

We learned this memory verse:

For the LORD will vindicate his people and have compassion on his servants. (Psalm 135:14)

Wednesday

Judges 3:1–11

Why doesn't God get rid of all the nations in the land?
What do the people of Israel do with the other nations?
Does God judge them? When Israel turns to God for help, what does God do?

Thursday

Joshua 4:1–15, 22–24

Why does God give Israel into the hands of an evil king?
What happens when they cry to God for help?
Does God listen and save them? How?

Friday

Joshua 5:1–5, 19–21, 31

Who sings this song? Why do they sing it?
Who is the song all about?
What does the song say about those who love God?
